AN ACT

Supplementary to "An Act to erect the towns of Wrightsville and Westphalia, in the county of York, into a borough, to be called Wrightsville."

Boundaries.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the villages of Wrightsville and Westphalia, in the county of York, heretofore erected into a borough, called the borough of Wrightsville, shall hereafter be bounded and limited as follows, to wit: beginning at a birch tree on the bank of the Susquehanna river, on land of William Wright; thence on said land south seventy-five and a quarter degrees west one thousand five hundred and forty-eight feet to a black oak stump; on land of Asa Loudon; thence by said land south eleven and a half degrees east one thousand four hundred and eighty feet to the north side of Locust street; thence along the north side of said street south seventy-seven and a half degrees west one thousand five hundred and thirty-two feet to a post, on land of Samuel W. Mifflin; thence along said land south eleven and a half degrees east four hundred and eighteen feet to the middle of the turnpike; thence along the middle of the said turnpike north seventy-eight degrees east one thousand nine hundred and thirty-four feet to the west side of Third street; thence along the west side of said Third street and land of Joseph Detwiler south twenty-six degrees east nine hundred and forty-four feet to a post, within twenty feet of the south side of Orange street; thence on said street north sixty-eight and a quarter degrees east three hundred and sixteen feet to the west side of Barnes' alley; thence along the west side of said alley and Joseph Detwiler's land south twenty-one and three quarter degrees east four hundred and ninety-four feet to a post, within twenty feet of the south side of Maple street; thence through lots one hundred and sixty-eight, one hundred and seventy-four, and one hundred and seventy-seven south nine and three quarter degrees east seven hundred and seventy feet to a hackberry tree, on the bank of Crenitz's creek; thence down said creek and on lands of heirs of Henry Strickler, deceased, and of Joseph Detwiler south thirty-three and a half degrees east one thousand three hundred and twenty feet to a post, on land of heirs of James E. Mifflin, deceased; thence along said land and land of Jabez Jenkins north seventy-eight and a half degrees east one thousand four hundred and twenty feet to a poplar stump, on Jenkins' land; thence by said land north eleven and a half degrees west three hundred and ninety-six feet to the mouth of Crenitz's creek, at the Susquehanna river; thence up the said river the several courses thereof, five thousand two hundred and eighty-six feet to the place of beginning.

SECTION 2. All that part of the borough of Wrightsville, lying north of Maple street, together with so much of the plan or plot made by Jacob Bahn, in the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, as represents that part of the aforesaid borough, shall be and the same are hereby established and confirmed; and all the streets, lanes, alleys and highways south of Wilton's line, shall be and are declared public

highways, according to their limits and bounds, as laid down on the plot made by Jacob Bahn; all other streets, lanes, alleys or highways, shall be and the same are hereby vacated, except the public road leading from Hellam street to Peter Kline's, which shall be and remain open and unobstructed, until Front street, which is intended to supply its place, shall be made passable; all the streets, lanes, alleys and highways in that part of the borough, composing a part of Wilton farm, shall be and the same are hereby vacated; and all parts of streets, lanes, alleys or highways, that lie within the bounds of the said farm as conveyed to H. Wilton, on the thirteenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, by William Wright, shall be and they are hereby vacated.

SECTION 3. All that part of the borough of Wrightsville, south of Maple street, including said street, together with so much of the plot or plan made by Jacob Beitler, in September and October, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, as represents that part of the aforesaid borough, shall be and the same are hereby established and confirmed; and all the streets, lanes, alleys and highways, shall be and are hereby declared public highways, according to the bounds and limits laid down on the plan made by the said Beitler, and all others shall be and are hereby vacated.

SECTION 4. The town council of the said borough shall immediately after the passage of this act, cause a certified copy of the said plan to be filed in the recorder's office, in and for the county of York, and the same shall be sufficient and conclusive evidence in the settlement of any controversy that may arise in regard to the location of any of the streets, lanes, alleys or highways, within the limits of the said borough: *Provided*, That so much of Front street as passes through the property of John Kauffelt, between Locust and Hellam streets, shall not be altered or changed in any manner or form, but shall remain in all respects as it is and would have been, if this supplement had not been passed; and all the plots, plans, drafts of the said borough, whether on record or otherwise, shall and they are hereby rendered null and void, except so much of the plan made by Jacob Bahn, as is described in second section of this act, and so much of the plan made by Jacob Beitler, as is described in the third section of this act, which shall be and they are hereby established and confirmed, according to their respective bounds and limits, as laid down on the aforementioned plans; and so much of the existing laws to which this is a supplement, as conflict with the same, shall be and are hereby repealed.
