

hundred and forty-five, and ascertain whether there was assessed or paid into the state treasury, a greater amount for state taxes than was required by law to be assessed or paid, for the years one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, and one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, on the valuation of trades, professions and occupations, and on salaries and emoluments of office, or on other property in said county, and a greater amount of taxes than was required by law, and the report of the board of revenue commissioners, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-five; and if upon such re-examination he shall find that a greater amount of state taxes was so assessed or paid into the state treasury by said county, for said years, or any of them, than was required to be assessed or paid by law, or by the report of said commissioners, the auditor general shall certify the amount so over assessed or overpaid to the state treasurer, and to the county commissioners of said county; and said county shall be entitled to a credit for the amount, so certified on the books of the auditor general and state treasurer, on account for state taxes, which now are or hereafter shall be chargeable against said county, as the case may be; and the county commissioners and county auditors of said county, shall produce and furnish such statements, accounts, books and papers, as the auditor general may require, to enable him to determine the amount of state taxes, if any, overpaid by said county, as aforesaid.

AN ACT

Relative to notaries public in Dauphin county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of an act, entitled "An Act to enable the governor to appoint notaries public, and for other purposes therein mentioned," approved the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty, as renders, or has been construed to render, justices of the peace ineligible to the office of notary public, be and the same is hereby repealed, as far as relates to Dauphin county.*
