A N A C T

To change the grade and name of the Snyder Rangers, a volunteer company in Washington county, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the Snyder Rangers, a volunteer rifle company in the second brigade, fourteenth division, Pennsylvania militia, be hereby changed into an infantry company, to be called the Snyder Independent Light Infantry, and in that character, shall be entitled to draw, through the proper brigade inspector, such arms and accoutrements to which an infantry company may be entitled under existing laws; and in all respects have the same privileges, and be under the same restrictions as if they had been originally organized an infantry company.

SECTION 2. And that the act entitled "An Act to increase the revenues and diminish the expenses of the commonwealth," approved the sixteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, so far as relates to the payment of the sum of ten dollars on every law changing the name of a corporation, shall not be construed to apply to any volunteer company.

SECTION 3. That from and after the passage of this act, the Honesdale Infantry Guards, of Wayne county, shall be exempted from parading or drilling with any regiment or battalion of militia, except at the discretion of the company.
