AN ACT

To authorize the burgess and town council of the borough of Hanover, in the county of York, to erect a lock-up house in said borough.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the burgess and town council of the borough of Hanover, in the county of York, be and they are hereby authorized to build and erect, or provide and support in or contiguous to said borough, a suitable building, to be used as a lock-up house or place of security, for the temporary detention of persons committed by a justice of the peace on a criminal charge, or breach of the public peace, for which such person or persons could be lawfully committed to the county prison, there to remain and be kept, until such offender or offenders can be conveniently conveyed to the county prison, or until discharged according to law; said building to be erected or provided under the control and direction of David Deihl, Jacob Newman, Joseph W. Schmidt, esquires, commissioners, whose duty it shall be to erect or provide said building, and report the cost of the same to the burgess and town council of the borough of Hanover, to be paid out of the funds of said borough: Provided, That no person committed by a justice of the peace, shall be confined in said house for a longer period (at any one time) than twenty-four hours.*

AN ACT

Concerning views of roads and road damages in Northampton county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That hereafter the expenses of all road views, and the viewers of public roads, and of views to assess damages arising from the opening of public*

roads in the county of Northampton, shall be paid by the petitioners; and all assessments of damages arising from the opening of such road or roads, shall be paid by the respective townships or boroughs in which the same may be located; and the supervisors, or members of the town council of the said townships or boroughs, are hereby authorized to levy a tax for the payment of all such awards or damages, after the same shall have been affirmed by the court of quarter sessions of the said county.

SECTION 2. All such viewers, or a majority of them shall, hereafter, be selected from among the citizens of the respective townships or boroughs in which any road or roads, as aforesaid, are proposed to be located; and so much of all former laws as is in anywise altered or superseded by this act, is hereby repealed, so far as relates to said county.

AN ACT

To attach part of Blair township, in Blair county, to the Hollidaysburg borough common school district, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That that portion of Blair township, in the county of Blair, which lies to the north-eastward of Blair's Gap run branch of the Frankstown branch of the Juniata river, shall hereafter be attached to, and form part of the Hollidaysburg borough common school district, for all common school purposes.

SECTION 2. That hereafter the farm and dwelling house of Daniel Medsker, situate in Plum township, in Allegheny county, shall be attached to and compose a part of the Franklin township school district, in Westmoreland county, for all common school purposes, including the assessment and payment of school taxes.

SECTION 3. That the farm of Thomas Elder, now composing a part of the Harmony school district, in Westmoreland county, shall hereafter be attached to and compose a part of the Union school district, in said county.

SECTION 4. That the superintendent of common schools of this commonwealth, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favor of the treasurer of Shirley school district, in the county of Huntingdon, for such sum as said district
