

roads in the county of Northampton, shall be paid by the petitioners; and all assessments of damages arising from the opening of such road or roads, shall be paid by the respective townships or boroughs in which the same may be located; and the supervisors, or members of the town council of the said townships or boroughs, are hereby authorized to levy a tax for the payment of all such awards or damages, after the same shall have been affirmed by the court of quarter sessions of the said county.

SECTION 2. All such viewers, or a majority of them shall, hereafter, be selected from among the citizens of the respective townships or boroughs in which any road or roads, as aforesaid, are proposed to be located; and so much of all former laws as is in anywise altered or superseded by this act, is hereby repealed, so far as relates to said county.

AN ACT

To attach part of Blair township, in Blair county, to the Hollidaysburg borough common school district, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That that portion of Blair township, in the county of Blair, which lies to the north-eastward of Blair's Gap run branch of the Frankstown branch of the Juniata river, shall hereafter be attached to, and form part of the Hollidaysburg borough common school district, for all common school purposes.

SECTION 2. That hereafter the farm and dwelling house of Daniel Medsker, situate in Plum township, in Allegheny county, shall be attached to and compose a part of the Franklin township school district, in Westmoreland county, for all common school purposes, including the assessment and payment of school taxes.

SECTION 3. That the farm of Thomas Elder, now composing a part of the Harmony school district, in Westmoreland county, shall hereafter be attached to and compose a part of the Union school district, in said county.

SECTION 4. That the superintendent of common schools of this commonwealth, be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favor of the treasurer of Shirley school district, in the county of Huntingdon, for such sum as said district

AN ACT

To alter an act, entitled "An Act to reduce the expenses of the militia system of this commonwealth, and provide a more rigid mode for the collection of militia fines," passed the twenty-fifth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, so far as it respects the second brigade, ninth division, of the Pennsylvania militia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the training of the militia by companies, in the second brigade, ninth division, of the Pennsylvania militia, shall hereafter be on the first Monday in June; and the trainings of the militia in said brigade, by battalions and regiments, shall commence on the second Monday in June.

Time of training militia in 2nd brigade, 9th division, changed.

Duty of brigade inspector.

SECTION 2. That the brigade inspector of said brigade, shall forward a list of delinquents and amount of fines levied, to the auditor general of this commonwealth, and a copy of fines levied, to the commissioners of the respective counties within his brigade, as is provided in the sixth section of the act which is hereby altered, on or before the fifteenth day of July in every year.

Duty of county commissioners.

SECTION 3. That the county commissioners in the several counties within the brigade aforesaid, shall, on or before the first Monday in August in each and every year, make out duplicate copies of the returns of delinquent field and staff officers, and enrolled militia, and deliver the same to the respective collectors, in the manner provided for in the seventh section of the act which is hereby altered, except as to the time of making out and delivering the same; and the respective collectors to whom the duplicates and warrants of commissioners are delivered, in pursuance of the provisions of the said seventh section, are required to perform the duties therein enjoined on them, in the same manner, and
