AN ACT

To authorize the auditor general to settle the claim of Thomas C. Hambly.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized and empowered to audit and settle the claims of Thomas C. Hambly, counsel for the commonwealth, in the case of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, against the estate of Ferdinand L. Spangler, deceased; and also in the case of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, against Edward Prigg, and others, argued in the supreme court of the United States, at Washington, and allow him such compensation for his services, as counsel in said cases, as he may deem just and proper, not exceeding the sum of three hundred and ninety-five dollars: *Provided, That the auditor general shall* Proviso. be clearly satisfied from the evidence, that said Thomas C. Hambly was employed by the commonwealth in said case, by authority of law, or at the request of the executive or attorney general, so far as relates to the case against the said Prigg, and others.

SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act to authorize the incorporation of a company to erect a bridge over the Kiskiminetas river, at or near the town of Warren, Armstrong county," approved fifteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-four.

WHEREAS, A controversy has arisen among the commissioners appointed in the act to which this is a supplement, in regard to the subscription to the stock of said corporation; therefore,

Commissioners.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* John Townsend, James Paul and Jesse Clements, of Westmoreland county, Jacob M'Cartney, Michael Cochran and Samuel Guthrie, of Armstrong county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to perform the duties enjoined upon the commissioners named in the said act; that the time within which said duties shall be performed is hereby extended until the first Monday of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, or so much longer as may be required to perform the duties required by said act.

Subscription of
stock.

SECTION 2. That the said commissioners herein named shall permit all responsible persons, who shall wish to subscribe to the stock of said corporation, on the payment of the five dollars on each share of stock, to subscribe such number of shares as they may wish; the majority in number of said stockholders, at any meeting regularly called, shall determine the kind of bridge to be erected; and the first annual meeting of said stockholders shall be held on the first Monday of October next.

Repeal.

SECTION 3. That the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement, so far as is inconsistent with this act, be and the same is hereby repealed.
