

result, and to be taxed as costs for similar services are now allowed by law.

SECTION 15. That this act shall not take effect until the third Friday of March next, from which time, the existing road laws, so far as they are supplied or altered by this act, are hereby repealed, in the aforesaid township of Lower Mount Bethel.

SECTION 16. That from and after the passage of this act, the supervisors of Mill Creek township, in the county of Lebanon, shall enter into a bond to the commonwealth, for the use of the said township, in double the amount of the duplicate of taxes assessed for any one year, for township purposes, with at least one approved security, conditioned for the faithful collecting of the same, and accounting for all moneys received by them, and paying over all balances in their hands, to their successors in office; which bond, with approved security, shall be given at the next court of quarter sessions of the said county, immediately succeeding their election; and the said court shall approve of the same, and shall have power to allow the accounts of the said supervisors, and compel settlement thereof at least once in a year.

AN ACT

Relative to the appointment of a trustee for Elizabeth Hawk.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That it shall be lawful for the court of common pleas of Lebanon county, on reasonable cause being shewn, to commit the custody and care of the person and estate of Elizabeth Hawk, of said county, a person represented as being incapable of maintaining her estate, to such person or persons as the said court shall deem suitable, in the same manner and with the same effect, as if a return of inquisition finding the said Elizabeth Hawk, a lunatic, had been made to said court, under the provisions of the act, entitled "An act relating to lunatics and habitual drunkards," passed the thirteenth day of June, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and

AN ACT

To authorize the court of quarter sessions of Allegheny county, to vacate Delaware lane, in said county, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the court of quarter sessions of the peace of Allegheny county, shall have power to vacate Delaware street or lane, from Pennsylvania avenue, to De Villiers street, in the city district, adjacent to the city of Pittsburg, and said court shall proceed to vacate the whole or any part of said street, by the appointment of viewers, and on their report in the same manner in all respects, as is directed by existing laws, for viewing and vacating state or county roads.

Court of quarter sessions of Allegheny county, to vacate Delaware lane.

SECTION 2. That the select and common councils of the city of Pittsburg, shall have the power to change and permanently locate, the southern line of Coal street, between Elm street and Fulton street, in said city, in such manner as will be most advantageous to the public, and to alter the name of said street to Webster: *Provided,* That the said alteration, when made, will not in any manner injure public or private property, on said street.

Councils of Pittsburg, to change location of coal street.

SECTION 3. *That the streets, lanes and alleys, in the town of Donaldson, in the county of Schuylkill, and the streets, lanes and alleys, in the town of Charleston, in the county of Union, are hereby declared public highways, according to the plots of said towns, and to be subject to the provisions of the laws regulating public roads.*

Streets, lanes and alleys in Donaldson, Schuylkill county, and Charleston, Union county, declared public highways.

Association to construct a hotel in Pittsburg, may construct an arch.

SECTION 4. That any persons who may be associated together for the purpose of erecting a hotel in the city of Pittsburg, in the vicinity of Wood street and Virgin alley, shall be and they are hereby authorized to construct or cause to be constructed, an arch forty-four feet long, over the northern end of the alley in said city, lying next to Wood street, and extending from Fifth street to Virgin alley, between Wood and Market streets: *Provided,* That before said arch shall be constructed, the plan thereof, shall first be approved by the select and common councils
