AN ACT

To authorize the court of quarter sessions of Allegheny county, to vacate Delaware lane, in said county, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the court of quarter sessions of the peace of Allegheny county, shall have power to vacate Delaware street or lane, from Pennsylvania avenue, to De Villiers street, in the city district, adjacent to the city of Pittsburg, and said court shall proceed to vacate the whole or any part of said street, by the appointment of viewers, and on their report in the same manner in all respects, as is directed by existing laws, for viewing and vacating state or county roads.

Court of quarter sessions of Allegheny county, to vacate Delaware lane.

SECTION 2. That the select and common councils of the city of Pittsburg, shall have the power to change and permanently locate, the southern line of Coal street, between Elm street and Fulton street, in said city, in such manner as will be most advantageous to the public, and to alter the name of said street to Webster: *Provided,* That the said alteration, when made, will not in any manner injure public or private property, on said street.

Councils of Pittsburg, to change location of coal street.

SECTION 3. *That the streets, lanes and alleys, in the town of Donaldson, in the county of Schuylkill, and the streets, lanes and alleys, in the town of Charleston, in the county of Union, are hereby declared public highways, according to the plots of said towns, and to be subject to the provisions of the laws regulating public roads.*

Streets, lanes and alleys in Donaldson, Schuylkill county, and Charleston, Union county, declared public highways.

Association to construct a hotel in Pittsburg, may construct an arch.

SECTION 4. That any persons who may be associated together for the purpose of erecting a hotel in the city of Pittsburg, in the vicinity of Wood street and Virgin alley, shall be and they are hereby authorized to construct or cause to be constructed, an arch forty-four feet long, over the northern end of the alley in said city, lying next to Wood street, and extending from Fifth street to Virgin alley, between Wood and Market streets: *Provided,* That before said arch shall be constructed, the plan thereof, shall first be approved by the select and common councils

of said city ; and said arch shall be of sufficient dimensions to permit the passage of carts, drays and stages.

SECTION 5. That the act, entitled "An act providing for the collection of part of the road tax of Franklin township, Allegheny county, in money, approved the first day of April, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, be and the same is hereby repealed."

Act relative to the collection of road taxes in Franklin township, Allegheny county, repealed.

SECTION 6. That the seventh resolution of the resolution, entitled "A resolution legalizing the election of a justice of the peace, in the borough of Dillsburg, in the county of York, and for other purposes," approved the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, be and the same is hereby repealed ; and that the seventh section of the original act, entitled "An act for the relief of the overseers of the poor, of the borough of Erie, and for other purposes," passed the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, be and the same is hereby continued in full force.

Pittsburg and Connellsville railroad company.

SECTION 7. That an act entitled "An act declaratory of the third section of an act, entitled 'An act to authorize the administrators of Henry Mineum, late of Crawford county, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate, and for other purposes,' approved the second day of July, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine," approved thirteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-six, be and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

Relative to stocks in incorporated companies purchased of the commonwealth, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized and required to assign, transfer, and deliver to the purchaser or purchasers of stocks owned by the commonwealth in any company, sold under the provisions of the act of eighth of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, entitled "An Act for the payment of the domestic creditors of the commonwealth, sale of state stock, and for other purposes," any certificate or certificates of stock held by the state in any such companies, which may be in his or any other public office in Harrisburg, agreeably to the provisions of any act incorporating any such company.

Auditor general authorized to transfer stocks sold by the commonwealth.
