SECTION 5. That the act, entitled "An act providing for the collection of part of the road tax of Franklin township, Allegheny county, in money, approved the first day of April, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, be and the same is hereby repealed."

SECTION 6. That the seventh resolution of the resolution, entitled "A resolution legalizing the election of a justice of the peace, in the borough of Dillsburg, in the county of York, and for other purposes," approved the nineteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, be and the same is hereby repealed ; and that the seventh section of the original act, entitled "An act for the relief of the overseers of the poor, of the borough of Erie, and for other purposes," passed the eighteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, be and the same is hereby continued in full force.

SECTION 7. That an act entitled "An act declaratory of the third section of an act, entitled 'An act to authorize the administrators of Henry Mineum, late of Crawford county, deceased, to sell and convey certain real estate, and for other purposes,' approved the second day of July, eighteen hundred and thirty-nine," approved thirteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-six, be and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

Relative to stocks in incorporated companies purchased of the commonwealth, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized and required to assign, transfer, and deliver to the purchaser or purchasers of stocks owned by the commonwealth in any company, sold under the provisions of the act of eighth of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, entitled "An Act for the payment of the domestic creditors of the commonwealth, sale of state stock, and for other purposes," any certificate or certificates of stock held by the state in any such companies, which may be in his or any other public office in Harrisburg, agreeably to the provisions of any act incorporating any such company.

Auditor general authorized to transfer stocks sold by the commonwealth.

How notice of
annual election to
be given.

SECTION 2. That in all cases hereafter, where the president and managers of any of the above companies shall neglect or refuse to give notice for holding the annual elections, at the time now required by law, it shall be lawful for any five stockholders to give public notice in one or more newspapers, as soon as possible after the first failure, which notice shall not be less than twenty days previous to the election; and any election held in pursuance of said notice, shall be as valid as if it had been called by the president and managers.

Governor to ap-
point viewers.

SECTION 3. That when any change of location of any said turnpike is made by authority of the legislature, and a new road made in pursuance thereof, it shall be the duty of the governor, on notice thereof given to him by any of the said companies, to appoint three reputable persons to view the same, who shall proceed in accordance with the laws relative to the incorporation of the said turnpike road company; and if the said road be approved, the said company or companies are hereby authorized to receive toll thereon, at the same rates as they are authorized now by law to receive.

Relative to un-

SECTION 4. That the eleventh, twelfth, and thirteenth sections of an act, entitled "A further supplement to an act, entitled 'An Act authorizing the laying out and locating a state road from the borough of Elizabethtown, in Allegheny county, and for other purposes,' approved the twenty-second day of March, A. D., one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, be and the same are hereby repealed; and that so much of any act as appropriates the tax upon unseated land, in any township in Bradford county, to the construction or improvement of any road not under the care and supervision of the commissioners of highways in said townships respectively, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Authority to lay
out a state road
in Blair county,
repealed.

SECTION 5. That so much of the seventh section of an act, authorizing the laying out of sundry state roads, passed the fourteenth April, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, as authorizes the laying out a state road through Snyder township, Blair county, be and the same is hereby repealed.
