AN ACT

Regulating the assessment of tax in Chester county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, all seated or unseated land or tracts of land, situated in the county of Chester, containing one hundred acres or more, shall be assessed and taxed in the respective townships in which such tracts of land lie.

Assessment regulated.

SECTION 2. And so much of the eighth section of an act, entitled "An act to authorize Thomas Gardener, Benjamin Y. Miller and Isaac Coates, trustees, to sell and convey certain real estate, and for other purposes," approved the twenty-third day of June, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two; and so much of the fifty-ninth section of an act, entitled "An act regulating election districts, and for other purposes," approved the eleventh day of July, one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, as is altered or supplied by this act, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as relates to Chester county.

Certain acts relative to assessments in Chester county, repealed.

AN ACT

For the relief of James Kelley and Philip Young, soldiers of the Revolutionary war.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to James Kelley, of Allegheny county, and Philip Young, of Beaver county, or to their respective orders, an annuity of forty dollars during life,
