Concerning the claims of Alfred Royer, of Indiana county.

Canal Commis-
sioners to exam-
ine claim of A.
Royer.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners are hereby authorized and required to examine the claim of Alfred Royer, for damages alleged to have been done to his boat in June, eighteen hundred and forty-four, while being conveyed up plane number nine, on the portage railroad, in charge of the state agents; and if they shall clearly ascertain that said damages were occasioned by the negligence or misconduct of any of said state agents, or insufficiency of state ropes or other fixtures, they shall assess the same, and report the amount, together with the facts, to the next legislature.

A N A C T

Relating to the election of path masters in the county of Erie, and for other purposes.

Election of path-
masters.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified citizens of the different townships in Erie county, shall hereafter elect the path masters at the same time and in the same manner as other township officers are now by law elected; and so much of the third section of the act to amend the road laws of Erie county, and for other purposes, passed the twenty-sixth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, as is hereby supplied, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION 2 That so much of the second section of the act, entitled "A supplement to an act authorizing the Governor to incorporate the Clifford and Carbondale turnpike road company, and for laying out a

road from the Virginia state line, in the county of Fayette, to Centre-ville, in the county of Somerset, and for other purposes," passed eighteenth April, eighteen hundred and forty-three, as prohibits any person, who is not a resident citizen of this commonwealth, from being treasurer of the Cochection and Great Bend turnpike road company, be and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract of Enos Eastwood and Louisa, his wife.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into between Enos Eastwood and Louisa, his wife, the latter a resident of the county of Luzerne, that of the former not known, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from said contract, and from all duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully and effectually, and absolutely, as if they never had been joined in marriage.*
