A N A C T

Authorizing Thomas Elliott and John Mather, trustees, to re-convey certain real and personal estate to Thomas Mather.

WHEREAS, Thomas Mather, of the township of Ulster, Bradford county, did on the twenty-sixth day of December, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, convey to Thomas Elliott and John Mather, all his real and personal estate in trust, for the use of his wife Agnes, and such children as he then had, or might thereafter have, by his said wife Agnes, such deed of trust having been induced by reason of habits of intemperance, which the said Thomas Mather had unfortunately acquired : Preamble.

And whereas, Agnes, the former wife of said Thomas Mather, is deceased, and the said Thomas has again contracted marriage, and has children by his present wife, and has become thoroughly reformed in his habits, and is fully competent to manage his own estate ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Thomas Elliott and John Mather, of Bradford county, are hereby author-

Power to re-convey. ized to convey, and transfer by proper assurances, in fee, to Thomas Mather, all the estate, real and personal, the title to which is now vested in them, as trustees, by reason of a deed of conveyance executed to them by the said Thomas Mather, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of December, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four; and that from and after the execution of said conveyance, the said trustees shall be discharged from said trust, as effectually as though the same had never been created.

AN ACT

Authorizing the laying out of a state road from the Conneaut lake and Georgetown road, near Samuel Minises' farm, on the line which divides the counties of Mercer and Crawford, and along said line to Jamestown, so as to intersect the Jamestown and Kinsmantown road.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Joseph Cochran, Edward Eells, of Crawford county, and William Dunn, of Mercer county, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners, to view and lay out a state road, from the Conneaut lake, and Georgetown road, near Samuel Minises' farm, on the line which divides Mercer county from Crawford, and from thence along said county line to Jamestown, so as to intersect the Jamestown and Kinsmantown road.

Commissioners to lay out road.

Location.

Duty of commissioners.

SECTION 2. *It shall be the duty of the said board of commissioners, or a majority of them, after taking and subscribing an oath or affirmation before a justice of the peace, to perform the duties enjoined upon them by this act, with impartiality and fidelity, to carefully view the ground over which said road may pass, and to lay out the same on the said county line, wherever the nature of the ground will permit, so that the vertical departure from a horizontal line shall at no point exceed five degrees, except only at crossing ravines and streams, where, by a moderate filling or bridging, the declination of the said road may be preserved within that limit.*

Mark route.

SECTION 3. *That it shall be the duty of the said commissioners, plainly and distinctly to mark the ground on the routes agreed upon for the road aforesaid, in such manner as to enable the supervisors readily to find the same; and for the purpose of fulfilling the duties in this act enjoined, the said commissioners are hereby authorized to employ, at a per diem allowance, not exceeding one dollar each, two chain carriers;*
