Giving the assent of this commonwealth to the act of the Legislature of New Jersey, entitled "A supplement to the act, entitled 'An act to incorporate the Alexandria Delaware bridge company,' passed March fifth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one."

Assent.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the assent of this commonwealth, be and the same is hereby given to the provisions mentioned in the act of the legislature of the state of New Jersey, passed fifth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one, entitled "An act to incorporate the Alexandria Delaware bridge company;" and the said act of the legislature of the state of New Jersey, is hereby adopted, ratified and confirmed by this commonwealth, and the provisions thereof, shall be in full force and effect, in this commonwealth; and the said act of the legislature of the state of New Jersey, shall be annexed to this act, and be published in the same manner as the laws usually are; and the governor shall likewise cause an exemplified copy thereof, to be deposited in the secretary's office of this commonwealth, and transmit an attested copy of this act to the governor of the state of New Jersey.

A supplement to the act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Alexandria Delaware bridge company," passed March the fifth, eighteen hundred and forty-one.

Exemption from
payment of toll.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and General Assembly of the State of New Jersey,* That persons going to or returning from religious meeting or church, upon the Christian Sabbath, or first day of week, commonly called Sunday, shall be allowed to pass the said bridge free of toll, and upon that day only.

Repeal.

SECTION 2. So much of the eleventh section of the act to which this is a supplement, as provides for the passage of persons going and returning from religious meeting or church, free of toll, be and the same is hereby repealed, passed March first, eighteen hundred and forty-five.

A N A C T

To prevent the destruction of game in the county of Perry.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, it shall not be lawful for any person in the county of Perry, to shoot or otherwise kill any wild turkey, pheasant, partridge or rabbit, between the first days of March and August, nor any woodcock between the first days of January and July, in any year hereafter, under a penalty of five dollars for each and every offence.

SECTION 2. Any person offending against any of the provisions of this act, shall forfeit and pay the sum or fine attached to the same, with all costs and charges, which may be recovered before any justice of the
