AN ACT

For the relief of Jacob Garrison, late collector of school taxes in the township of Aleppo, in the county of Greene, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the time for collecting the school taxes in the township of Aleppo, in the county of Greene, be and the same is hereby extended until the first Monday in May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven; and that Jacob Garrison, late collector of school taxes in said township, is hereby authorized and empowered to collect all school taxes due and unpaid on his duplicate, in said township, prior to the expiration of his appointment.

AN ACT

To authorize the state treasurer to refund certain money overpaid as collateral inheritance tax, by Philip Lauer.

Preamble.

WHEREAS, It is represented that Philip Lauer, late administrator with the will annexed, of Henry Masser, late of Moreland township, Montgomery county, deceased, on the sixth day of January, eighteen hundred and forty-three, paid to the register of wills of said county, the sum of forty-three dollars and ninety-four cents, as collateral inheritance tax, on the estate of said decedent, which, as appears by the final settlement of said administrator, was eighteen dollars and forty-
