AN ACT

Authorizing David Gordon to collect certain outstanding tax, in the township of Robinson, in the county of Washington, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That

Relative to Robinson township, Washington county.

David Gordon, late collector of taxes for the township of Robinson, in the county of Washington, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, be and he is hereby authorized to exercise, for the space of two years from the passage of this act, all the powers and authorities conferred on him by any legal warrant which he heretofore held, as collector of taxes in said township, for the year aforesaid; any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Executors of C. Stewart, authorized to collect tax in Nippenose township, Lycoming county.

SECTION 2. That the executors of Charles Stewart, late collector of taxes for the township of Nippenose, in the county of Lycoming, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-two, be and they are hereby authorized to exercise, for the space of two years from the passage of this act, all the power and authorities conferred on the said collector by any legal warrant which the said Charles Stewart heretofore held, as collector of taxes in said township, for the year aforesaid; any law to the contrary notwithstanding.

Relative to lease of real estate, in Bucks county.

SECTION 3. So much of the ninth section of the act, entitled "An Act relating to the support and employment of the poor," passed June thirteenth, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, requiring persons to take a bona fide lease of real estate, of the yearly value of ten dollars, be and the same is hereby repealed, so far as it relates to the county of Bucks; and that hereafter, the sum required in lieu thereof, in the said county of Bucks, shall be ten pounds.

Relative to taxes in Pine township, Armstrong county.

SECTION 4. That the acting executor of William L. Love, late collector of taxes for the township of Pine, in the county of Armstrong, for the year one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, be and he is hereby authorized and required to exercise, for the space of two years from the passage of this act, all the powers and authorities conferred on the said collector, by any warrant or warrants which the said William L. Love heretofore held, as collector of state, county and school taxes, in said township, for the year aforesaid; any law to the contrary notwithstanding.
