

SECTION 3. That the said corporation shall be able to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, in any court of record, or elsewhere. Powers.

SECTION 4. That the said corporation shall have power to use a Seal. common seal, and the same to change, alter or renew at pleasure.

SECTION 5. That the members of said corporation shall meet at some Annual meeting. convenient place, on the last Saturday in April next, at which time, and annually thereafter, they shall elect by ballot, a president, and such other officers as may be required by the by-laws of said association.

SECTION 6. That the said corporation, or a majority of all its members, shall have full power, at all times, to make and enforce such by-laws, rules and regulations as may be deemed necessary for the proper government of said association, and to revoke, alter or amend the same at pleasure: *Provided*, That the said by-laws, rules and regulations be not inconsistent with this charter, or with the constitution and laws of this commonwealth. By-laws. Proviso.

SECTION 7. That this act shall continue in force ten years from the Term of continu- passage thereof; and no longer; and the legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul this charter, at any time hereafter. Reservation.

AN ACT

To provide for the construction of an in-let lock, near Beach Grove, on the North Branch division of the Pennsylvania canal.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That whenever the business of mining coal, and the preparations for bringing the same to the Pennsylvania canal, for shipment upon it, on the lands lying on the opposite side of the river from said canal, at Shick-shurney, shall have progressed so far as, in the opinion of the board of canal commissioners, to ensure the shipment, annually, of at least two thousand tons of coal on the Pennsylvania canal, from these mines, the canal commissioners shall be and are hereby authorized to cause an in-let lock to be constructed at some convenient point, to admit said coal into the North Branch division of the Pennsylvania canal. When canal commissioners shall construct in-let lock.

SECTION 2. Said in-let lock shall be constructed in the most economical manner consistent with the permanency, and at a cost of not more than eight thousand dollars; and the annual increase of tolls on coal, Expenses of construction, how to be paid.

LAWS OF PENNSYLVANIA,

for passing on the Pennsylvania canal, from the North Branch division, after it shall have been constructed, is hereby specifically appropriated to defray the expense of constructing said in-let.

AN ACT

Authorizing the commissioners of the Northern Liberties, county of Philadelphia, to alter the survey and regulation of Haydock street, in said district, and for other purposes.

Alter grades of
Haydock street.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the board of commissioners of the incorporated district of the Northern Liberties, shall be and they are hereby empowered to cause such an alteration to be made to the regulation of the heights and descents of Haydock street, below Front street, in said district, as they may deem proper, doing the least possible injury to private estates.

Surveyors in
Penn district, to
revive levels, &c.

SECTION 2. That the surveyors of the district of Penn, in the county of Philadelphia, be and they hereby are authorized and empowered to revive the established levels and grades in the said district, and make such alterations therein as in their opinion the public convenience and interest may require, of which alterations they shall make a correct draft or plan, which, when approved of by the board of commissioners of the said district, shall be and remain unalterable; and a copy thereof shall be filed in the office of the clerk of the court of quarter sessions for the city and county of Philadelphia.
