Relative to the "German society contributing for the relief of distressed Germans, in the state of Pennsylvania."

Exempt from
payment of cer-
tain taxes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the real estate of the "German society contributing for the relief of distressed Germans, in the state of Pennsylvania," situate on the west side of Seventh street, between High and Chesnut streets, in the city of Philadelphia, be and the same is hereby exempted from poor and corporation taxes, so long as the real estate shall be owned by the said society, and used for the purposes set forth in the act of incorporation of said society.*

A N A C T

To authorize the state treasurer to refund certain money to John Shearer.

WHEREAS, John Shearer, late register of wills, in and for the county of Montgomery, claims to have overpaid his account due the commonwealth, fourteen dollars and forty-one cents, agreeably to statements made; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to John Shearer, register aforesaid, the sum of fourteen dollars and forty-one cents, out of any funds in the treasury not otherwise ap-*

propriated: *Provided*, The same should be found due by the auditor general.

AN ACT

Relative to universities, colleges and academies, in the city and county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That where any trustee, manager or director of any university, college or academy, established by authority of any law of this commonwealth, has removed, to reside out of the state, or has neglected, or refused to attend the meetings of the board whereof he is a member, during two years next preceding the passage of this act; or who shall hereafter remove to reside out of the state, or neglect or refuse to attend the meetings, as aforesaid, for one entire year, in all such cases, the person so removing, or neglecting or refusing, shall cease to belong to the board of which he may be a member, and his place shall be supplied in the manner prescribed by law, for filling vacancies occasioned by death or resignation, in such university, college or academy: *Provided however,* That nothing in this act shall be construed to impair the right of any board of trustees, managers or directors of such university, college or academy, to establish by-laws and make provision for filling vacancies occasioned by delinquencies for a shorter period, or to impair any rules or by-laws already existing in any such institution: *Provided*, This act shall only extend to the city and county of Philadelphia.
