AN ACT

To authorize the auditor general to settle the accounts of Thomas B. Town, late paymaster general and disbursing officer of volunteers.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized and required to credit Thomas B. Town, on account of the balance due the commonwealth from him, with the sum of five hundred and eighty-three dollars and thirty-three cents, which shall be in full of all the claims of the said Thomas B. Town, against the commonwealth, as late paymaster general and disbursing officer of volunteers, and immediately to adopt the most efficient means to collect the balance which said officer will still owe the commonwealth.
