AN ACT

Authorizing the canal commissioners to settle the account of J. and D. Pattison."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be and they are hereby authorized to settle the claim of John and David Pattison, for digging and cribbing a well for the commonwealth, on the lot attached to the collector's office, at the junction of the Beaver division, Pennsylvania canal, with the Ohio canal, according to their contract with Samuel Kerr, superintendent, and pay the amount which may be found due, not exceeding forty-two dollars, out of the damage fund.

AN ACT

To authorize the commissioners of Lycoming county, to borrow money, and for other purposes.

Commissioners
authorized to bor-
row money.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the commissioners of Lycoming county, with the approbation of the auditors thereof, obtained in writing, are hereby authorized to borrow, on the credit of said county, any sum not exceeding ten thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum, redeemable in eighteen hundred and fifty-four, or sooner, at the pleasure of said commissioners, and to issue therefor certificates of indebtedness, in the usual way; but no such certificate shall issue for any part of said loan, less than two hundred dollars.

SECTION 2. That said loan, as soon as it shall be taken, shall be paid into the treasury of said county, and immediately applied to the redemption of the orders, warrants and notes heretofore issued, and unre-

deemed by said county; and the residue, if any, shall be applied forthwith to the payment of all other debts against said county; and all said orders, warrants and notes, when redeemed as aforesaid, shall be burnt by the treasurer of said county, in presence of said auditors thereof, who shall, at the same time, attest a record to be made by said treasurer, in his book, showing the dates and denominations of all such orders, warrants and notes so redeemed and burnt.

SECTION 3. That so much of any law as authorizes the payment of Premium on fox a premium for the scalps of foxes, by said county of Lycoming, is hereby scalps, repealed, so far as respects said county. repealed, in Lycoming co.

SECTION 4. That from and after the passage of this act, the daily Pay of commis- sioners of Clinton per day for each day necessarily employed in discharging their several county fixed. duties; and no pay shall be hereafter allowed to any person or persons who shall act as inspector, judge or clerk, in holding township or borough elections within the county aforesaid.

SECTION 5. That the court of quarter sessions of Clinton county shall Court of Clinton have power, with the concurrence of the grand jury of said county, to county authorized incorporate into a borough, and body politic and corporate, the village to incorporate of Mill Hall, in said county, although said village may not contain three Mill Hall into a hundred inhabitants; and all proceedings may be had in relation to the borough. incorporation of said village into a borough, which, by existing laws, may be had for the incorporation of villages into boroughs, where the same contains three hundred inhabitants.

SECTION 6. SECTION 7. That Christian Hoffer, Michael Hackman and Thomas Trustees of Six Cronomiller, trustees of the Six United Congregations of the German United Congre- Reformed churches in Penn's valley, and Brush valley, in the county gations in Penn's of Centre, be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and and Brush valleys, convey, by deed or deeds, in fee simple, to John Oswald, that certain Centre county, tract or parcel of land situated in Gregg township, Centre county, authorized to sell adjoining lands of George Herring, David Oswald and Peter S. Fisher, real estate. containing twenty acres, forty-eight perches, and allowance, it being the same tract of land sold and conveyed by Samuel Borell and wife, by deed bearing date the twentieth day of March, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, to John Keller, Henry Myer, Jacob Runkle and others, trustees of the said Six United Congregations of the German Reformed churches in Penn's valley and Brush valley, to and for the use of the aforesaid several congregations, as a glebe for the ministers, for the time being; and the said John Oswald is hereby authorized and empowered to execute a mortgage on said property, to the said Christian Hoffer, Michael Hackman and Thomas Cronomiller, their heirs and successors in trust, for the use of them, the present trustees, and their heirs, to secure the payment of the balance due of the consideration money thereof, according to the agreement and sale made between the said trustees and the said John Oswald.

SECTION 8. A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled, "An Act to incorporate the Upper Dublin, Lewisville, Whitehallville and Nazareth turnpike road company," passed the seventeenth day of April, eighteen hundred and forty-five, changing the name and title of said company to that of the Northern turnpike road company, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the turnpike road company, incorporated by the act to which this is a supplement, shall have full power and authority to locate and construct their turnpike road from the point of intersection of the Welch road with the Cheltenham and Willow Grove turnpike road; thence on the bed of the Welch road to a point at or near the end of Samuel Mann's lane; thence in as near a north direction as practicable, until it connects with the present road of said company, as now located, pursuant to the act of incorporation: *Provided,* That Samuel Mann, John G. Bates, Jesse Shoemaker, John L. Jones, Thomas Pennington, Benjamin Foster, Clement Jones, Henry Jones and John B. Holland, shall not be com-
