A SUPPLEMENT

To the act incorporating the Perkiomen and Sumneytown turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Perkiomen and Sumneytown turnpike road company, incorporated by the act, approved the fourteenth day of February, eighteen hundred and forty-five, shall not, for the period of ten years from the passage of this act, be required to open and lay out their road more than thirty-three feet wide; nor within said time be required to make any summer road at the side thereof, except at such places as in the opinion of the board of managers, may be necessary for the safety of travelers passing along or across the said turnpike road. AN ACT

To incorporate the Trappe brass band, of Montgomery county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That all and every person or persons who shall, at the time of the passing of this act, be or hereafter become members of the association called the Trappe brass band, of Montgomery county, shall be and they are hereby created and declared to be one body politic and corporate, by the name, Incorporation. style and title of the Trappe brass band. The sole object, business and purpose of this corporation, is declared to be instruction and improvement in instrumental music; and the said corporation shall have full authority to take all measures that may be necessary to promote such object; and shall be able to sue and be sued, implead and be impleaded in all courts of record, or elsewhere; and to purchase, receive, have, Privileges. hold, and enjoy, to them and their successors, lands, tenements, rents, annuities, franchises and hereditaments, goods and chattels of what

nature, kind or quality soever, real, personal or mixed, or choses in action; and the same from time to time to sell, grant, devise, alien, or dispose of: *Provided*, That the clear value of the houses, lands and tenements, rents, annuities or other hereditaments, and real estate of the said corporation, shall not exceed the sum of four thousand dollars; and also to make and have a common seal, and the same to break, alter and renew at pleasure; and also, to ordain, establish and put in execution such by-laws, ordinances and regulations as shall appear necessary and convenient for the government of the said corporation, not being contrary to this charter, or the constitution and laws of the United States, or of this commonwealth, and generally to do all and singular the matters and things which to them it shall lawfully appertain to do, for the well being of the said corporation, and the due management and ordering of the affairs thereof: *Provided*, That this act shall continue in force for twenty years from the passage thereof, and no longer, for the purpose aforesaid; and the legislature reserves the right to alter, amend or annul this charter at any time hereafter.

SECTION 2. That the present directors of the said association shall continue to act as such until the second Saturday of May next, at which time, and annually thereafter, the said corporation shall elect a president, and such officers as may be required in the constitution and by-laws of said association, for the proper government thereof.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act incorporating the Marietta, Bainbridge, Falmouth and Portsmouth road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same*, That the time for completing the Columbia, Marietta and Portsmouth railroad, be and the same is hereby extended for the period of five years, from the time specified in the act of seventh May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-one.
