

opinion of the said court, shall be certified to the governor, to be by him communicated to the next succeeding legislature.

SECTION 11. That the supplement to an act to authorize the Baltimore and Ohio railroad company to construct a railroad through Pennsylvania, in a direction from Baltimore to the Ohio river, approved twentieth June, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine, and the act to which it was a supplement, be and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 12. That if the railroad by this act authorized to be constructed by the said Baltimore and Ohio railroad company, be not commenced within two years from and after the thirtieth July, eighteen hundred and forty-seven, and finished within twelve years from the date of this act, then this act shall be null and void; the legislature hereby reserves the right to alter, revoke or annul the privileges herein conferred, whenever, in their opinion, the interests of the commonwealth may require it; in such manner, however, that no injustice shall be done to the Baltimore and Ohio railroad company.

AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract of Tobias Bilger and Caroline, his wife.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the marriage contract entered into between Tobias Bilger of Juniata county, and Caroline, his wife, late Caroline Page, be and the same is hereby annulled and made void, and the parties released and discharged from all duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, and effectually, and absolutely, as if they never had been joined in marriage.
