To annul the marriage contract of William Dusenberry, and Mary, his wife.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into between William Dusenberry and Mary, his wife, of the county of Philadelphia, be and the same is hereby annulled, and made void, and the parties released and discharged from all duties and obligations arising therefrom, as fully, and effectually, and absolutely, as if they had never been joined in marriage.*

A N A C T

To authorize Robert Adams, committee of Henry Burnside, a lunatic, of Wolf Creek township, Mercer county, to contract with James Pond, of said county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Robert Adams, committee of lunacy of Henry Burnside, of Wolf Creek township, Mercer county, be and is hereby authorized to contract with James Pond, a brother-in-law of said lunatic, for the maintenance and support of said lunatic during his natural life; and that he be authorized to convey to the said James Pond, the whole, or a part of real and personal estate of said lunatic, for that purpose, according to the approval and direction of the court, having jurisdiction to order a sale of the estate of said lunatic; and the sale so made shall be good and valid, to transfer to the purchaser all the interest and title of said lunatic: *Provided*, That before said approval, the said James Pond shall give bond to the commonwealth, in such sum and with such sufficient sureties as*

shall be approved by said court, conditioned that he will maintain, and support comfortably in all things, said lunatic, during his natural life.

AN ACT

For the relief of certain soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to John Alexander, formerly of Pennsylvania, and now of Butler county, Ohio, and Benjamin Reynolds, of Bradford county, Pennsylvania, or to their respective orders, an annuity of forty dollars during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, A. D., eighteen hundred and forty-six.

SECTION 2. That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and directed to pay to David Hull, of Armstrong county; Henry Rust, of Crawford county; Shadrach Michell, of Greene county; John Burk, of York county; Samuel Dean, James M'Donald, Henry Semans, Christina Gehret, of Berks county; Catharine Wilcox, of Fayette county; Catharine Cogley, of Armstrong county; and Magdalena Reigelman, of Berks county, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars, or to their respective orders, an annuity of forty dollars each, during life, payable half yearly, to commence on the first day of January, A. D., eighteen hundred and forty-six.

SECTION 3. That the third section of the act of twelfth of April, eighteen hundred and forty-five, entitled "An Act for the relief of William Burns, Elizabeth Noble, and others, soldiers and widows of soldiers of the Revolutionary and Indian wars," be hereby altered and amended, so as to read Richard Parker, instead of Richard Patton, and the gratuity given by said section shall be paid to the said Richard Parker: *Provided,* That such gratuity has not been paid to any person under the provision of said section.
