AN ACT

Erecting the borough of Ebensburg, and part of Cambria township, in Cambria county, into a separate school district.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the borough of Ebensburg, and that part of Cambria township, in Cambria county, which will, by right angle lines, include the mansion houses of Stephen Lloyd, John D. Hoover, Joseph M'Donald, and William Wherry, and the grist mill of John Williams, and the fulling mill of Robert Griffith, be and the same is hereby erected into a separate school district, with all the rights, and subject to all the restrictions given and imposed by the several school laws of this commonwealth.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act for the relief of the Cumberland Valley railroad company," passed the fourteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Cumberland Valley railroad company shall have power to borrow a further sum of money, not exceeding fifty thousand dollars, to be applied towards defraying the expenses of repairing their said road, and re-building their bridge across the Susquehanna, at Harrisburg; and the better to secure any person or persons, corporation or corporations, who may loan, or may have loaned to the said company, any sum or sums of money, for the purposes aforesaid, the said company is hereby authorized to pledge their road and bridge across the Susquehanna, the
