AN ACT

To provide for the payment of certain claims upon the commonwealth.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That

Appropriation. the sum of six hundred dollars be and the same is hereby appropriated to pay the claim of Bolard and David, agreeably to an award made in their favor by the canal commissioners, in pursuance of the act of assembly, entitled "An Act relative to the claim of Bolard and David," approved the thirteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-six ;

Bolard & David. and the sum of seventy-five dollars and seventy-two cents is hereby appropriated to pay the balance due to James Horrell, late supervisor, as

AN ACT

To authorize the construction of an embankment for the protection of the borough of Sunbury, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That

Borough of Sunbury and supervisors of Augusta township, authorized to construct an embankment. the corporation of the borough of Sunbury, and the supervisors of the township of Augusta, or such persons as the said borough and supervisors shall authorize, shall have power to construct an embankment on the land belonging to the estate of the late Thomas Grant, deceased, and to use the said embankment for a public road, if advisable.

SECTION 2. That the said corporation, or supervisors or citizens, shall have power to enter upon and over so much of the land lying contiguous to the said embankment, and to use such materials as may be necessary for the construction of said embankment, first paying the owner or

Power to enter upon lands.

owners, the full value thereof, or give security for the payment of the Damages to be same; and for the purpose of ascertaining the amount thereof, if the first paid. parties cannot agree upon the same, either party may petition the court of common pleas of Northumberland county, setting forth the facts, praying for the appointment of viewers to assess the damages, (if any;) whereupon, the said court shall appoint three disinterested persons, who shall examine the premises and assess the damages, after being first duly sworn, and make return to said court; which report, upon being approved by said court, shall be final and conclusive; and the amount thereof, together with the costs of said proceeding, shall be paid by said borough and said township, in equal proportions, by an order drawn on their respective treasurers.

SECTION 3. That William F. Murray, Daniel Kendig and Martin W. F. Murray, Kendig, be and they are hereby authorized to erect a break-water in the Swatara creek, within six hundred feet from the mouth of said creek, and not exceeding forty feet in length, from low water mark, in such manner as shall do no damage to either public or private property, nor create any obstruction to the navigation of said stream.

AN ACT

Concerning certain records of the supreme court, and certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That*

an amount not exceeding two hundred and fifty dollars of the tax upon writs of error, in the supreme court for the western district of Pennsylvania, from the first day of September, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-five, till the thirty-first day of August, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be and the same is hereby appropriated to the prothonotary of the said court, for the said district, for bringing or writing up the records of the said court, for six years last past, and making and transcribing indexes to the said records, for ten years last past, and arranging the papers of said court; that said compensation not exceeding said sum hereinbefore specified, shall be fixed by said court, after their examination and approval of said records so brought up by said prothonotary.

Tax upon writs of error in supreme court appropriated to prothonotary for services rendered.
