RESOLUTION

To authorize the superintendent of common schools to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favor of the treasurer of the school district of Spring Creek township, Warren county, and in favor of the treasurer of Paint township school district, Clarion county.

WHEREAS, It appears that the school district of Spring Creek, in the county of Warren, and the district of Paint, in the county of Clarion, have been prevented by peculiar circumstances, from receiving the amount of appropriation due them as accepting districts; therefore,

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the superintendent of common schools of this commonwealth be and he is hereby authorized and directed to draw his warrant on the state treasurer, in favor of the treasurer of Spring Creek school district, in the county of Warren, and the Paint township school district, in the county of Clarion, for such sum as said districts would have been entitled to receive if their certificates of assessment of school tax had been filed before the passage of the act, entitled "An Act to provide for the ordinary expenses of government, repairs of the canals and railroads of the state, and other claims upon the commonwealth," approved the thirty-first day of May, eighteen hundred and forty-four.

RESOLUTION

Providing for the payment of the witnesses who attended before the committee appointed to try the validity of the election of Thomas S. Bell.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized and required to ascertain and settle the claims of witnesses, (excepting Josiah W. Evans and Jacob Hunsicker) who attended before the committee appointed to try

the validity of the election of Thomas S. Bell, returned as elected a senator from the third senatorial district, in the year eighteen hundred and thirty-eight, agreeably to the report of said committee, and shall draw his warrant on the state treasurer in favor of said witnesses, respectively, for the amount found to be due to them respectively, for their attendance as witnesses as aforesaid, which warrant shall be paid out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated.

RESOLUTION

Explanatory of the supplement to an act, passed March twenty-ninth, one thousand eight hundred and three, to establish a board of wardens of the port of Philadelphia, and for other purposes, approved February fourth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That in the proviso of the fourth section of the supplement to an act, passed March twenty-ninth, one thousand eight hundred and three, to establish a board of wardens of the port of Philadelphia, and for other purposes, approved February fourth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, nothing shall be construed so as to abridge or impair, in any manner, the authority of the wardens of the port of Philadelphia, in the regulations of pilots and other matters, as provided in the act of March twenty-ninth, eighteen hundred and three; and that the proviso of the sixth section of said supplement, to wit: "*Provided, That the said fees shall not be collected on vessels under the burthen of seventy-five tons, nor on any canal boats trading on the canals of this commonwealth, and shall not exceed fifty cents on each vessel,*" shall be so construed as to authorize the wardens of the port of Philadelphia to collect a sum not exceeding fifty cents on each vessel, for each and every voyage by such vessel performed, and no more.
