## RESOLUTION

Relative to the accounts of Joseph Mann, brigade inspector of the first brigade, second division, Pennsylvania militia.

Auditor general  
to allow certain  
payments in the  
settlement of ac-  
counts of Joseph  
Mann.

*Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met,* That the auditor general be and he is hereby authorized to allow Col. Joseph Mann, brigade inspector of the first brigade, second division of the Pennsylvania militia, credit on settlement of his accounts, for the sum of two dollars and eighty-six cents, due from the estate of William Barnhill, deceased, twenty-one dollars due from William Osmand, collectors for the year eighteen hundred and forty; also the sum of nine dollars due from Mathias Kiple, twenty dollars and eighty cents due from Amos Cape, and three dollars due from Michael R. Ott, collectors for the year eighteen hundred and forty-one, if the said brigade inspector shall furnish satisfactory evidence said sums of money are not collectable, and have not been lost by his neglect.

Adjutant general  
to repair arms,  
&c.

*Resolved,* That the adjutant general of this commonwealth is hereby authorized to have all the state arms that he may find in the different brigades and arsenals, not occupied by regular organized volunteer companies, put in repair, except such as in his opinion are not worth the expense of repairing, and to put those which he shall not deem worth repairing to sale at such times and places as he may think proper, applying the proceeds thereof to defray the expense of repairing and moving, and other expenses thereby incurred.

Expenses, how  
to be paid.

*Resolved,* That in case receipts of sales be not sufficient to defray the whole of the expense of repairing and moving to the different arsenals, the balance shall be paid by the state treasurer of this commonwealth.

To keep list of  
arms sold and  
repaired.

*Resolved,* That the said adjutant general shall keep, or cause to be kept, a complete list of all the arms repaired and sold by him, designating the expense of repairing and moving the same, with the receipts of sale and other accounts, and transmit the same to the auditor general, under oath, to be filed in his office.
