A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the law incorporating the Bridge Point, Bushington and Centreville turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the time for opening the books for subscription to the stock of said company, is hereby extended to any period of time not exceeding the first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven; and the time for commencing said road is extended to the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight; and the officers directed to be elected by the third section of the act of incorporation, shall conduct the business until the first day of November, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, when an election is to be held agreeable to the provisions of said act.*

AN ACT

To increase the number of trustees of Haddington college, in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Jacob Weaver, Charles Eastburn, Daniel Ashton, James Shaw, William P. Smith, J. B. Beers, Joseph Plotts, Joseph S. Pickering, William F. Morgan, John Caldwell, Joseph Jermon, W. W. Marriner, James Hattrick, Chauncey Bulkley and John B. Moses, shall be additional trustees of the Haddington college, in the county of Philadelphia, who, with the present trustees of the same, shall hereafter be the trustees thereof, with the same powers, privileges, rights and corporate immunities as if they had been named as trustees of the same, in the*

act passed the thirty-first day of March, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Marshall college of Mercersburg, and to incorporate the Haddington college in the county of Philadelphia;" and the trustees hereby constituted, or a majority of them, may proceed in carrying out the objects of the said Haddington college, as effectually as if the same were now first incorporated.

AN ACT

To confer on John C. Stanley, junior, of Lancaster, the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That John C. Stanley, junior, son of John C. Stanley of Lancaster, shall have and enjoy all the rights and privileges of a child born in lawful wedlock; and shall be able and capable in law to inherit and transmit any estate whatsoever, as fully and effectually, as if he had been born in lawful wedlock.*
