A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act to authorize the governor to incorporate the president and managers and company of the Richborough and Feasterville turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the fifth section of the act of the legislature, entitled "An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate the president, managers and company of the Richborough and Feasterville turnpike road company," passed the eighteenth day of April, Anno Domini eighteen hundred and forty-four, as requires the president and managers to cause the said road to be laid out not less than forty feet in width, be and the same is hereby repealed ; and the said road may be laid out of any width : Provided, It be not less than thirty-three feet, nor more than fifty feet ; and so much of said road as is already laid out, may be made to correspond with this provision.*
