AN ACT

To regulate the holding of courts in Juniata county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the first day of August, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, no venire shall issue in the county of Juniata, for the summoning of a petit or grand jury for the February term of the several courts of said county; and so much of the twenty-ninth section of the act, entitled "An Act relative to the organization of the courts of justice," passed April fourteenth, eighteen hundred and thirty-four, as is hereby altered or supplied, is hereby repealed.*

AN ACT

To authorize Harriet Coleman to sell certain real estate.

Power to sell.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That Harriet Coleman, guardian of Anna Coleman, Sarah Coleman and Harriet Coleman, minor children of James Coleman, late of the county of Lancaster, deceased, is hereby authorized and empowered to sell, either publicly or privately, convey and assure all the right, title and interest of the said minor children, of, in and to the whole or any part or parts of a certain plantation, or two contiguous tracts of land, with the hereditaments and appurtenances to the same belonging or appertaining, situate in the counties of Lancaster and Berks, whereof the said James Coleman died seized, in his demesne as of fee, the said tracts of land being the same which Henry Binckley and Elizabeth, his wife, by indenture, dated the first day of June, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred*
