AN ACT

To appoint commissioners for the purpose of keeping in good order and repair that part of the East and West state road, west of Fayette Corners, in the county of M'Kean, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That Jonathan Marsh, Isaac Smith and Samuel Wall, be and are hereby **Commissioners** appointed commissioners, for the purpose of improving and keeping in **appointed.** good order and repair that part of the East and West state road, west of Fayette Corners, in the county of M'Kean, subject to the same liabilities as supervisors of highways are, under the existing laws of this commonwealth.

SECTION 2. That one third of the road tax levied in the township of Fayette; one-third of the road tax in the township of Hamilton; one-fourth of the road tax levied in the township of Corydon, in said county of M'Kean, shall be paid to the said commissioners for the purposes aforesaid; and in case the taxes aforesaid, shall be deemed insufficient to keep said road in good order and repair by said commissioners, they shall levy and collect a tax upon the unseated lands of the several townships before mentioned, not exceeding five mills on the dollar in any one year, according to valuation for county rates and levies; which tax shall be levied and collected in the same manner as supervisors of highways are authorized to do by law. **Road tax to be paid to commissioners.**

SECTION 3. That said commissioners shall annually settle their accounts with the several township auditors mentioned in this act, and shall be allowed a reasonable compensation, not to exceed one dollar per day for the time which they shall be engaged in working on said road. **To settle accounts.**

SECTION 4. That in case of death or resignation in said board of commissioners, the court of quarter sessions of the county of M'Kean, shall fill said vacancy by appointment; and in case said commissioners, or either of them, shall neglect or refuse to discharge the duties of their office with fidelity, the said court may remove them, or either of them, from office, and supply the vacancy occasioned thereby. **Vacancies, how supplied.**

SECTION 5. That the act of the sixteenth of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty five, entitled "An Act appointing commissioners to run and establish the line between the counties of Warren and M'Kean, and for other purposes," shall be so construed **Relative to division line between Warren and M'Kean counties.** as to fix the intersection of the line run by the commissioners appointed by said act, with the former Warren county line, east of the Kenzua creek, so as to include the entire tract on which O. L. Stanton resides, in the county of M'Kean, over which the jurisdiction of said county of M'Kean is hereby extended: *And provided further,* That the act referred to in this section, shall not interfere with the consummation of any legal proceedings in the county of M'Kean, pending prior to the passage of said act. **Proviso.**

SECTION 6. That before the commissioners appointed by the first section of this act, shall enter upon the duties of their office, they shall give bond. **Commissioners to give bond.**

give a bond for the faithful application of all moneys received by them, and for the faithful discharge of the duties of their office, which said bond shall be approved by the court of quarter sessions.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled “An Act to incorporate the Meadville theological school,” passed the seventh day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and forty-six.

Classification of
members of the
board.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the members of the board of instruction of the Meadville theological school, are authorized to arrange the time at which the several terms of office shall expire, so as that the term of office of one of them shall terminate at the end of the second year; of another, at the end of the third year; of another, at the end of the fourth year, and of another, at the end of the fifth year; and that the board of instruction shall determine by lot, the time at which the term of office of the present members of said board shall respectively expire. And further, that nothing in the act to which this is a supplement, shall be so construed as to prevent the re-election of any members of said board.

Tenure.

SECTION 2. That the members of the board of trustees of said school, shall hold their offices until they become vacant by death or resignation; and that five members thereof, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

Power to diminish
number of
board.

SECTION 3. That the board of trustees and the board of instruction shall, by united action, have power to diminish the number of the members of the latter board, whenever it shall be deemed expedient to do so.

Repeal.

SECTION 4. That so much of the original act, to which this is a supplement, as is inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same is hereby repealed.
