A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act supplementary to the acts relating to hawkers and pedlers, and regulating auctions in the county of Schuylkill.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the provisions of the act, entitled "An Act supplementary to the acts relating to hawkers and pedlers, and regulating auctions in the county of Schuylkill," approved the seventeenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, be and the same are hereby extended to the counties of Lebanon and Elk, Cumberland and Perry, Carbon and Berks, and also to the county of Fayette, with reference to carrying from place to place, and exposing to sale articles of tin and copper ware.

AN ACT

To erect part of Norwegian township, in Schuylkill county, into a new township, to be called East Norwegian township, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the township of Norwegian, in the county of Schuylkill, as is now embraced in the general election district, whose electors vote at the town of Port Carbon, be and the same is hereby established and erected into a new township, to be called the township of East Norwegian.

East Norwegian township erected.

SECTION 2. That the qualified electors of said township shall, at the usual time for holding the township elections in the county of Schuylkill, elect one person for supervisor and one person for township treasurer; and that the said supervisor and treasurer shall lay a rate or assessment, not exceeding one cent in the dollar, in the manner, upon the

property, and for the purposes which supervisors of townships are now authorized to make, by the provisions of the act of fifteenth April, eighteen hundred and thirty-four, entitled "An Act relating to county rates and levies and township rates and levies."

SECTION 3. That it shall be the duty of the supervisor and treasurer of said township, annually, to appoint some suitable inhabitant of said township, at a meeting to be convened for the purpose, to be collector of the township rates and levies, who shall give bond, with at least two sufficient sureties, to the satisfaction of said supervisor and treasurer, conditioned for the faithful discharge of his duty as collector, as aforesaid. Collector. Surety.

SECTION 4. That the said township of East Norwegian be and the same is hereby enacted and established into a separate common school district, to be called the East Norwegian common school district. School district.

SECTION 5. That the qualified electors of that part of the said township of Norwegian, not embraced in the part hereby established and erected into a new township, shall hold their township elections at the public house of Peter Kline, in the town of New Castle; and that the qualified electors of the township of East Norwegian, enacted by the first section of this act, shall hold their township elections in the town of Port Carbon, where the general elections are now by law held. Place of holding elections.

SECTION 6. That the qualified electors of the township of Woodward, in the county of Clearfield, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of John Whiteside, in said township. Clearfield.

SECTION 7. That the qualified electors of the township of Thornbury, in the county of Delaware, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the public house of Jesse Russell, in said township. Delaware.

SECTION 8. That the qualified electors of the township of West Nantmeal, in the county of Chester, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the Indian-town school house, in said township. Chester.

SECTION 9. That the qualified electors of the borough of Columbia, in the county of Lancaster, shall be entitled, at the ensuing March election, in the year eighteen hundred and forty-seven, and annually thereafter, to elect an additional constable, subject to the regulations and provisions of existing laws. Columbia borough, elect additional constable.

SECTION 10. That the qualified electors of East Findley township, in the county of Washington, shall hereafter hold their general and township elections at the house of the late Andrew Stotler, deceased, in said township. Washington.

SECTION 11. That the electors of the borough of Prospect, in the county of Butler, shall, in addition to the officers now authorized by law, also elect, annually, one person to serve as constable of said borough, who shall be sworn in and qualified in court as other constables, and shall perform all the duties, and be subject to all the provisions of law relating to other constables. Borough of Prospect to elect constable.

SECTION 12. That the borough of Millsborough, in the county of Washington, be and is hereby declared a separate election district, and is hereby authorized to elect one judge and two inspectors, to hold the general election in said borough, and shall hold their general election at the school house in said borough. Washington, Millsborough, separate election district.

SECTION 13. That the officers conducting the township election of Bethel township, in the county of Lebanon, shall, on the third Friday of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, receive from the qualified voters of the townships of Bethel and Washington, tickets labeled "new township," and within either of the words "for Washington township." Lebanon, Bethel to decide by ballot on the erection of Washington township.

ington township," or "against Washington township." The officers of said election shall make return of the votes polled for and against the new township of Washington, to the next court of quarter sessions of said county; which return shall be filed among the papers of said court. If a majority of the votes polled shall be in favor of the new township of Washington, then the said new township shall remain as at present laid off; but if the majority of the votes polled, shall be against the new township of Washington, then there shall be no such new township; and the old township of Bethel shall remain as if the said new township of Washington had never been erected out of the same.

AN ACT

Relating to supervisors in the township of Carrol, in Washington county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from and after the passage of this act, all supervisors elected in the township of Carrol, and county of Washington, shall be required to give security, in such sums as the court of said county shall direct, for the faithful performance of their duties and correct application and return of all moneys received for tax.*
