AN ACT

Relating to certain streets in the county of Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* Biddle street, as laid out in the plan of the district of Spring Garden, Biddle street extending westward from the west side of Fairmount street, be and the widened. same is hereby widened on the north side thereof, so as to make the whole of the said street thirty-eight feet wide; and the said street is hereby continued and extended westward of the said increased width, until the same shall intersect with the north easterly side of Callowhill street, as laid down upon the said plan: *Provided, That the owners of* Proviso. land, through which the said street shall be widened and extended, release all claim for damages.

SECTION 2. That so much of Callowhill street, as laid down on the said plan of the district of Spring Garden, as extends north-westwardly Part of Callowhill street vacated. of the continuation of the north-westerly side of the abutments of the Suspension bridge, over the river Schuylkill, be and the same is hereby vacated.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* from and after the passage of this act, the citizens of the township

A. SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled “An Act relative to the organization of courts of justice.”

Time for holding
courts in Cum-
berland, Perry
and Juniata,
changed.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* from and after the passage of this act, the several courts in the county of Cumberland shall commence on the fourth Monday in August, in every year, instead of the second Monday, as now required; and that the term of said courts shall commence in Perry county, on the Monday next after the said fourth Monday in August; and in Juniata it shall commence on the second Monday next succeeding the term in Perry county, and that the said terms be continued respectively, if necessary, for one week.
