AN ACT

In relation to the sales of unseated lands in the several counties of this commonwealth.

Act repealed so far as regards the publication of notice in Philadelphia.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met. and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That so much of the first section of an act of the general assembly of this commonwealth, entitled "An Act to amend an act directing the mode of selling unseated lands for taxes, and for other purposes," passed the thirteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and fifteen, relating to the sales of unseated lands in the several counties of this commonwealth, as requires "the county treasurer to give at least sixty days' notice of the time and place of such sales, the township or townships in which the said tracts of land are respectively situated, the number of acres contained in each tract, and the names of the warrantees or owners thereof, and the sums due upon each tract for taxes, at least four times in one daily newspaper in the city of Philadelphia," be and the same is hereby repealed.

Treasurer to publish notice in the county.

SECTION 2. That it shall be the duty of the county treasurer to publish the notice, as aforesaid, in at least two newspapers, if so many be published within the county in which the lands lie; and if two newspapers be not published in the said county, then in one newspaper in or nearest to the same, under the same penalty in each case, and subject to the same provisions as specified in the said first section of the act above mentioned.

Act repealed so far as requires publication of notice in Philadelphia.

SECTION 3. That so much of the act of twenty-eighth March, seventeen hundred and eighty-six, and the supplement thereto, passed nineteenth January, seventeen hundred and ninety-three, entitled "An Act to empower the justices of the supreme court to supply defects in titles to lands, &c., as requires an advertisement to be published for three weeks or more in some of the public newspapers of the city of Philadelphia, be and the same is hereby repealed.
