

shall be declared according to the provisions of the act to which this is a supplement.

SECTION 2. That the said president and managers are hereby authorized and empowered to borrow, from time to time, any sum or sums of money, not exceeding, in the whole, ten thousand dollars, which they may deem necessary for the completion of said work, at any rate of interest not exceeding six per cent. per annum, in the name and upon the faith, credit and responsibility of said company, to pledge and mortgage the real estate and property of said company, or to issue certificates of such loans to the holders thereof, in sums not less than one hundred dollars each, and to make such provision out of the water rates of said company and the new stock hereby created, as may be necessary to pay the interest upon such loans, and to redeem the principal at such times and in such manner as may be conformable to the terms upon which the same may be taken.

AN ACT

Relative to the formation of a new school district out of certain townships in Washington county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the school directors of Nottingham, Somerset and Fallowfield townships, Washington county, or a committee of two from each board respectively, be and are hereby authorized and directed to meet at the house of Robert Clark, in Nottingham township, on the second Tuesday of April next, at ten o'clock, when they shall inquire into the expediency of erecting parts of three townships above named, into a sub-school district; and if, after a full and fair examination of the territory and the inconvenience under which the citizens of that neighborhood labor for schools, they, or a majority of them, should believe a new sub-school district necessary, they shall locate the same, and have a school house erected as near the centre of the district as possible, which shall be erected at the expense of the townships above named, each bearing equal proportion, to be paid from the school fund.

SECTION 2. After the location of said district, and erection of a house thereon, it shall be considered as belonging to the township of Nottingham for school purposes, and be under the supervision of the directors

AN ACT

Authorizing the governor to incorporate the Conestoga and Schuylkill turnpike road company.

Commissioners

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That for the purpose of constructing a turnpike road, commencing at the turnpike at or near where it crosses the Conestoga creek, east of Morgantown, in the township of Caernarvon, and county of Berks; thence by way of the Birdsborough bridge, to connect with the Reading and Perkiomen turnpike at or near Baumstown, in the township of Exeter, and county aforesaid, David Plank, David Mast, junior, of Berks county, Joseph Mast, Daniel J. Brunner, Edward Davis, David Jenkins, John C. Evans, James Everhart, Jacob Kertz, junior, Beynard Wey, Charles Robinson, Evan Evans, John M'Gowen, George Zerr, Cadwalder Morris, James L. Morris, Peter Zimmerman, David Styer, Lott Rogers, Edward Brooke, Henry Kupp, junior, Samuel Beard, junior, Ephram Scarlet, John Harrison, Jacob Kurtz, Thomas K. Bull, John Long and George Coleman, or any fifteen of them, be and they are hereby appointed to do and perform the duties herein mentioned, that is to say, they shall, as soon as convenient, procure a book or books, and therein enter as follows: "We whose names are hereunto subscribed, do promise to pay to the president, managers and company of the Conestoga and Schuylkill turnpike road company, the sum of twenty five dollars, for every share of stock subscribed, in such manner and proportions, and at such times and places as shall be determined by the said president and managers, in pursuance of an act of assembly, entitled 'An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate the Conestoga and Schuylkill turnpike road company.'
