AN ACT

Relative to the estate of the "Le Raysville Phalanx," in Pike township, Bradford
 county.

WHEREAS, An association, known as the Le Raysville Phalanx, con-
 sisting of various individuals, was formed in the year, Anno Domini Preamble.
 one thousand eight hundred and forty-four, in the county of Bradford,
 owning real and personal property :

And whereas, Said association having ceased operations, is desirous
 of settling all matters connected therewith, and for that purpose ask
 that trustees may be appointed, with power to sell and convey the estate
 belonging to said association ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
tives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly
met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That
 Gould Seymour, Daniel Bailey and Isaac Seymour, be and they are Trustees
 hereby appointed trustees, with full power and authority to take imme- appointed.
 diate charge of all property belonging to said association, and the same
 to sell or otherwise dispose of, as may be judicious and proper, and Empowered to
 execute deeds, and all other writings which may be necessary to execute; sell real estate.
 and their acts therein, or that of any two of them, (in case of the re-
 fusel or inability of either to act,) shall be as valid and effectual as
 though all the members of said association had joined therein : Pro- Proviso.
vided, That before the said persons shall take upon themselves the
 execution of the authority herein given, they shall file in the court of
 common pleas of said county, a bond to the commonwealth, with suffi-
 cient sureties, in such sum as said court shall direct, conditioned for the
 faithful performance of their duties aforesaid, and for the payment of

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all sums of money, which any of the parties interested may be entitled to receive, after the payment of all just debts due from said association.

A N A C T

In relation to elections in Perry county.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the qualified electors of the county of Perry shall, at the next election of the officers hereinafter named, and whenever hereafter it becomes necessary for an election of the same, to elect one person to fill the office of prothonotary and clerk of the courts of general quarter sessions and oyer and terminer, and one person to fill the offices of register of wills, recorder of deeds and clerk of the orphans' court.*
