AN ACT

Relating to the borough of Wilkesbarre.

Part of Wilkes-
barre boro' at-
tached to Wilkes-
barre township.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* that portion of the borough of Wilkesbarre, in Luzerne county, lying north-easterly of North street, which runs south-easterly and north-westerly, below the tannery of Bowman and Lewis, in said borough, be and is hereby set off and separated from the borough of Wilkesbarre, and attached to the township of Wilkesbarre; and that the upper or north-easterly side of said North street, extending from the Susquehanna river to the south-easterly line of the borough, shall be the north-eastern boundary of said borough, and the line between the borough and township of Wilkesbarre.

Detached part to
become a part of
said township.
Proviso.

SECTION 2. That said portion of the borough thus attached to the township of Wilkesbarre, shall become and be a part of said township, for all intents and purposes, in fact and in law, as if said portion had never been included within the bounds of said borough: *Provided, That* this act shall go into effect for the purpose aforesaid, from and after the first day of August next.

Qualification of
high constable.

SECTION 3. That it shall be lawful for the high constable of the borough of Wilkesbarre, in the county of Luzerne, to be sworn into office before a single judge in vacation, who shall decide upon the sufficiency of his bond; which bond and oath of office shall be filed with the clerk of the court of quarter sessions of said county, and have the same force and effect as if done in open court.
