AN ACT

Relating to premiums on wolf scalps in the counties of Monroe, Pike, Potter and Westmoreland.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That hereafter the counties of Monroe, Pike, Potter and Westmoreland, the bounty on full grown wolf scalps killed in said counties, shall be twenty-five dollars, and on wolf puppies five dollars; and so much of any law as is hereby altered, is hereby repealed: *Provided,* That no person shall be entitled to the above bounty, except he or they first prove, to the entire satisfaction of the aforesaid commissioners, that the said wolf or wolves were caught and killed in the aforesaid county, where the bounty is claimed.

AN ACT

Authorizing the canal commissioners to examine the claim of George J. Heisely.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the canal commissioners be and the same are hereby authorized and required to examine the claim of George J. Heisely, for compensation for making two leveling instruments, with tripod and cases, for use of the commonwealth, and draw their warrant upon the state treasurer for the amount which may be found justly due, not exceeding two hundred and forty dollars.
