AN ACT

Supplementary to an act relative to the Perkiomen and Sumneytown turnpike road company.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the third section of an act to which this is a supplement, entitled "An Act to authorize the managers of the Perkiomen and Sumneytown turnpike road company to apply the surplus tolls to the extinguishment of debts heretofore by them incurred," approved the twenty-second of January, eighteen hundred and forty-seven, be so construed as to leave it optional with the commissioners of Montgomery county, as to the transfer of stock from Matson's Ford bridge to said Perkiomen and Sumneytown turnpike road company. Commissioners of Montgomery county may change bridge stock for turnpike stock.

AN ACT

To authorize the commissioners of Warren and Allegheny counties to appropriate, out of the county funds, four hundred dollars each, for road purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same.* That the commissioners of Warren county may and they are hereby authorized to appropriate, out of the county funds, not to exceed four hundred dollars, to repair that part of the road on the west side of Allegheny river, between David Dalrymple's ferry and New York state line, on what is commonly called the narrows, a distance of about one mile and a quarter; and that the said commissioners are hereby authorized to appoint three competent persons, whose duty it shall be to expend such money in repairing and improving such part of said road as they deem most expedient, who shall give bonds for the faithful ex- Commissioners of Warren county to appropriate county funds for road purposes.

penditure of such money; which said bonds shall be approved by the court of quarter sessions; and shall, on or before the first day of January in each year, settle their accounts with the auditors of Warren county, in such manner as the accounts of other county officers are now settled, until the whole sum so appropriated shall have been expended.

SECTION 2. That so soon as the commissioners of the county of Allegheny shall be satisfied, by inspection thereof, that the road from the Allegheny river to Cunningham's mill, shall be completed in the manner directed in the order for that purpose, issued from the court of quarter sessions from said county, along the entire route between the two points mentioned, the said commissioners are authorized to draw their warrants upon the county treasurer, in the usual manner, for the sum of four hundred dollars in favor of the supervisors of Indiana township, upon their producing to the said commissioners a certificate, under the hands and seals and oaths of the said supervisors, or a majority of them, that they verily believe that the necessary expense of cutting down the hill or bluff, at or near Spang's mill, incurred by labor done thereon, after the date of the passage of this act, shall amount to four hundred dollars, or for such less sum of money as the said supervisors shall so certify, shall have been after that time necessarily expended for that purpose: *Provided always*, That the entire road shall be completed on or before the first day of December next ensuing the date hereof, and that the grade of the same, at the said hill or bluff, shall not exceed six degrees.

Loeser; and by that name the said adopted infant, Margaret A. Loeser, shall have and enjoy all the rights, benefits and advantages of a child born in lawful wedlock, of the bodies of the said
