AN ACT

For the relief of Samuel Rutherford.

State treasurer.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay Samuel Rutherford, or his order, the sum of two hundred and thirty-seven dollars and fifty cents, the amount due him for moneys expended on the Eastern division, Pennsylvania canal.*

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act to prevent the destruction of trout in Letart spring, and the preservation of the same in the county of Cumberland," &c.

Penalty for killing wild turkey, &c.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That from the first day of January to the first day of October, in each year hereafter, it shall be unlawful for any person to shoot, kill, trap or destroy any wild turkey, partridge or rabbit, in the county of Cumberland, under the penalty of five dollars for each and every offence.*

Woodcock, pheasant, &c.

SECTION 2. That from the first day of January to the first day of September, in each year hereafter, it shall be unlawful for any person to shoot, kill or destroy any woodcock or pheasant, in the county aforesaid, under the penalty of five dollars for each and every offence.

SECTION 3. That the fifth and sixth sections of the act to which this **Repeal.** is a supplement, be and the same are hereby repealed.

A SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled “An Act relating to dog tax in certain townships in Delaware county,” approved the fifteenth day of April, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the auditors of the several townships quoted in the act to which this is a supplement, shall be authorized and required to settle and adjust the accounts of the treasurers and collectors of dog taxes in said townships, at such time and places as the said auditors may meet, according to existing laws, to settle the accounts of other township officers. **Duties of auditors**

SECTION 2. It shall be the duty of said collectors, and they are hereby required to pay over to the treasurer of their respective townships, all such sum or sums of money as they may have in their hands; and upon the neglect or refusal to do so, they shall be subject to such fines and penalties as other township officers are now by existing laws: *Provided,* That said treasurers and collectors shall be entitled to a compensation of five per cent. upon all such moneys. **Collectors.** **Proviso.**

SECTION 3. The fourth section of the act to which this is a supplement, is hereby repealed.
