

SECTION 2. That the commissioners of said county, or a majority of them, and all others holding new stock in said bridge created in pursuance of the act before recited, shall be allowed at all and every election of managers under the original act of incorporation, and the supplement thereto, to give one vote for every share under five, and one vote for every five shares in addition of new stock aforesaid, held by said elector respectively : *Provided,* That to entitle such person to vote as aforesaid, he shall have held said stock at least thirty days before such election. Right of voting.

AN ACT

To provide against damage from gun cotton.

WHEREAS, An article called gun cotton, with properties of ignition and explosion similar to those of gun powder, and equally or more dangerous in towns and cities, has been introduced ; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That no gun cotton shall be introduced into Philadelphia, nor placed in storage therein, in greater bulk or quantity in any one place, than is permitted by existing laws with regard to gun powder ; and that all the pains, penalties and forfeitures imposed by an act, entitled “ An Act for securing the city of Philadelphia, and the neighborhood thereof, from damage by gun powder,” passed on the twenty-eighth day of March, seventeen hundred and eighty-seven, and a supplement thereto, passed on the fourteenth day of March, eighteen hundred and eighteen, shall apply and be extended to gun cotton in the same manner, and with the same effect, as if the word gun cotton were inserted in the said act. To prevent the introduction of gun cotton into Philadelphia, to a certain extent.
