

directors of the said township may hereafter issue their warrants to the collectors of county rates or levies, or to any other collector they may think proper, whose duty it shall be to collect the same, in the same manner, and for the same per centage as taxes of a like character are collected.

SECTION 5. That the court of quarter sessions in Tioga county, in appointing viewers to assess damages occasioned by laying out streets in the borough of Wellsboro', Tioga county, shall select persons residing within said county, but out of said borough; and said viewers shall make report to said court, and if the same shall be approved by the court, the damages awarded shall be paid out of the treasury of said borough.

SECTION 6. That from and after the expiration of the term of the present commissioner, section four, of an act, entitled "An Act authorizing a review of part of Emlenton and Centreville state road, and for other purposes," approved the twenty-eighth of March, eighteen hundred and forty, be and the same is hereby repealed; and the governor of this commonwealth is authorized and required to appoint two commissioners, one of whom shall have charge of that part of the Cumberland road lying east of the Monongahela river, and the other shall have charge of that part lying west of the Monongahela river; that each of said commissioners shall receive a yearly salary of three hundred and fifty dollars for his services, and shall perform the duties, and be subject to all responsibilities enjoined by the several acts of assembly relative to commissioners of the Cumberland road. That so much of the several acts of assembly relating to the Cumberland road, as is hereby altered, be and the same is hereby repealed.

AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract of Thomas Parker and Mary, his wife.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into between Thomas Parker and Mary, his wife, (the former residing in the city of Philadelphia and the latter in the city of New York) be and the same is hereby annulled and made*

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void, and the parties released and discharged from all the duties, liabilities and obligations arising therefrom, as fully and effectually as if they had never been joined in marriage.
