A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To an act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the Fishing Creek railroad company," passed the first day of April, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and thirty-one.

Commissioners
appointed to carry
into effect the

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That* George Richards, of Montgomery county; Simeon Guilford, of Lebanon county; George N. Eckert, of Schuylkill county; Thomas Baird, Franklin Miller, Isaac Eckert, of Berks county; Algernon S. Roberts, John M'Candless, Henry Eckford and Garrick Mallary, of the city of Philadelphia, be commissioners to carry into effect the act and supplements thereto to which this is a further supplement, for the purpose of constructing a railroad from the feeder of the Union canal, at the mouth of Fishing creek, up the valley of the said creek to the Broad mountain; and the said act and supplements and time for commencing be and hereby is extended to three years, and the time for completing the said road to five years from the first day of May, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven; and that the said company, to be incorporated under said acts, for the purposes therein mentioned, shall have and hereby are vested with additional rights and privileges of said acts, to survey and lay down, ascertain, mark and fix such further route as they shall deem expedient for a single or double railroad, and construct the same under the provisions of said acts, from the foot of the Broad mountain, between Sharp mountain, to a point on the Lorberry Creek railroad; and also up between the said mountains to the line dividing the counties of Lebanon and Schuylkill; with powers, furthermore, of increasing their capital to one hundred thousand dollars.
