AN ACT

To annul the marriage contract between Elizabeth Gardner and John Gardner, her husband.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the marriage contract entered into between Elizabeth Gardner and John Gardner, her husband, of the city of Philadelphia, be and the same is hereby declared null and void, and the parties discharged from all the obligations and liabilities growing out of the same, as fully and absolutely, as if they never had been joined in marriage.*
