RESOLUTION

Relative to Berlin borough school district, Somerset county, and Antrim school district, Franklin county.

Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, That the superintendent of common schools be and he is hereby authorized and required to draw his warrant in favor of the treasurer of the Berlin borough school district, Somerset county, for the amount due said district, arising out of the state appropriation for the school year eighteen hundred and forty-seven: *Provided however,* That in case the said district has already received her part of the state appropriation for said year, then and in that case no warrant should be drawn.

SECTION 2. That the twelfth, thirteenth, fourteenth and fifteenth sections of the act, entitled "An Act to authorize the governor to incorporate a company for the purpose of erecting a permanent bridge over the river Conemaugh, at or near Lockport, in Westmoreland county, and for laying out a state road from Blairsville, in Indiana county, to Mount Pleasant, in Westmoreland county, and for other purposes," passed the twenty-ninth day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-two, be and the same are hereby extended to the Antrim township school district, in the county of Franklin.
