

S. W. Lippencott authorized to exercise the privilege of an auctioneer in Philadelphia.

SECTION 3. That S. W. Lippencott, of the city of Philadelphia, may use and exercise all the privileges and rights conferred on him by a commission issued by the governor, bearing date the fifteenth of February, Anno Domini, eighteen hundred and forty-two, (as an auctioneer in the city of Philadelphia,) for any period of seven consecutive months, to be computed from any time hereafter, at which he shall recommence business as an auctioneer, in the city of Philadelphia. *Provided however,* That the said S. W. Lippencott shall not be at liberty to enjoy the privileges and rights hereby granted to him, until he shall have filed the like security for the faithful performance of the duties of an auctioneer, as would be necessary on taking out a new commission, similar to the one above recited: *And provided further,* That he shall make it appear, to the satisfaction of the secretary of the commonwealth, that he did not exercise the duties of an auctioneer, under the said commission, for a longer period than five months.

A SUPPLEMENT

To the act, entitled “An Act to provide for the election of prothonotaries, clerks, recorders and registers,” passed July second, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-nine.

Northampton

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the qualified electors of the county of Northampton shall, at the next general election, and thereafter whenever it becomes necessary to hold an election under the act to which this is a supplement, at the time and place of holding their general elections, elect one person to fill the office of prothonotary, and one person to fill the office of clerk of the court of general quarter sessions and oyer and terminer.

Repeal.

SECTION 2. That so much of the act to which this is a supplement as is inconsistent herewith, or altered hereby, be and the same is hereby repealed.
