## A SUPPLEMENT

To the act to establish an asylum for the insane poor of this commonwealth, passed April fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and forty-five.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the name of the asylum, for the insane poor of this commonwealth, as established by the act to which this is a supplement, be and the same is hereby changed to that of the Pennsylvania state lunatic hospital; Name changed. and so much of the third section of said act as requires the commissioners to build, finish, furnish and otherwise complete the said asylum for the sum of fifty thousand dollars, is hereby repealed; and it is hereby declared to be the intent and meaning of the act to which this is a supplement, that the said sum of fifty thousand dollars should be State contributed by the state, for the purpose of erecting an asylum for the insane poor of this commonwealth, and the said sum is hereby specification of buildings. tially appropriated for that purpose, to be paid by the state treasurer, on warrants drawn by the governor in favor of the commissioners named in the said act, at such times as the same may be required, for erecting, finishing and otherwise completing said asylum: *Provided*, That not more than one-third of said sum shall be drawn from the treasury in any one year: *And provided further*, That the names of Aaron Bombaugh, John A. Wier and James Fox, of the borough of Harrisburg, be added to the list of commissioners named in the act to which this is a supplement: *And provided*, That the fifteen thousand dollars appropriated by the act to which this is a supplement, shall be considered as a part of the fifty thousand dollars hereby appropriated: *Provided* further, That no part of said money shall be drawn from the treasury, until contracts shall have been actually made for the commencement of the said buildings; and no greater sum than ten thousand dollars shall be drawn from the treasury at any one time, or until the commissioners shall have filed vouchers for the amount drawn.
