AN ACT

To authorize the Humane fire engine company, of the county of Philadelphia, to sell certain real estate.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the Humane fire engine company, of the county of Philadelphia, be and the same is hereby authorized and empowered to sell, either at public or private sale, and to convey in fee simple, and to make and execute to the purchaser or purchasers thereof, a good and sufficient conveyance and assurance in law, a certain house and lot of ground, situate at the south-east corner of Saint John and Callowhill streets, in the district of the Northern Liberties, and county of Philadelphia. Power to sell certain real estate.

AN ACT

Declaring the streets and alleys in certain additions to the town of Danville, in Columbia county, public highways.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the streets and alleys in Montgomery's second addition, and Yark's and Sechler's addition to the town of Danville, and in such other additions as may come within the lines of the proposed borough of Danville, be and the same are hereby declared public highways, to be Streets and alleys of certain additions to the town of Danville, declared public highways.

AN ACT

Supplementary to an act, entitled "An Act to confirm the title of the General Greene beneficial society of the city and county of Philadelphia, to certain ground rents," passed the twenty-eighth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That*

First preamble of the act to which this is a supplement, altered, amended and supplied.

the first preamble of the act to which this is a supplement be altered, amended and supplied, so as to read as follows:—WHEREAS, George G. Williams and wife, and Joseph Fox and wife, by indentures dated the twenty-second day of March, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, recorded in the office for recording deeds for the city and county of Philadelphia, in deed book A W M, number thirty-one, page one hundred and eighty-seven, granted and assigned unto the said the General Greene beneficial society of the city and county of Philadelphia, and to their successors and assigns forever, all that certain yearly ground rent, a sum of forty dollars, lawful silver money of the United States of America, chargeable on, and issuing, and payable in half yearly payments forever, without any deduction for taxes, out of a certain lot or piece of ground situate on the south-east side of Otter street, at the distance of one hundred and twenty feet south-westward from Frankford road, in Kensington, in the county of Philadelphia: *And whereas*, George G. Williams and wife, by indenture, dated the eighteenth day of October, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and forty-seven, intended to be recorded, granted and assigned unto the said the General Greene beneficial society of the city and county of Philadelphia, and to their successors and assigns forever, all that certain yearly ground rent, a sum of thirty-five dollars, lawful silver money of the United States of America, chargeable on, and issuing, and payable in half yearly payments forever, without any deduction for taxes, out of a certain lot or piece of ground situate on the west side of Delaware Front street, at the dis-
