

name, style, and title of the "Saint Anne's widows' asylum of Philadelphia;" and by that title shall have perpetual succession, with power to have a common seal, to make contracts, sue and be sued, to take hold, mortgage, and convey any estate, real and personal, the annual income of which shall not exceed eight thousand dollars, to be appropriated to the purposes of the said charity; and to elect or appoint their associates and successors, to choose such officers as they may deem necessary, and to make all needful by-laws, rules and regulations for the government of said corporation, and the furtherance of said charity, not inconsistent with the constitution and laws of the United States or of this commonwealth.

SECTION 2. That the meetings of said corporation shall be held at such times and places as may be ordered by the majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

SECTION 3. That the building and other real estate occupied as an asylum by the said corporation, shall, during said occupancy, be exempt from taxation, except the state taxes.

SECTION 4. No misnomer of the said corporation shall defeat any intended gift, grant, conveyance, devise, or bequest thereto, if the intent shall sufficiently appear therein.

AN ACT

For the relief of George W. Patton.

WHEREAS, By an act of the general assembly of Pennsylvania, entitled "An Act relative to the claim of James M'Cann and George W. Patton," was approved on the twenty-fourth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, authorizing the auditor general to settle and adjust the account of George W. Patton, late supervisor on the Juniata division of the Pennsylvania canal, for any interest he shall have paid to the Bank of Lewistown, for money borrowed by him for the use of the commonwealth; *Provided*, The same shall not exceed the sum of one hundred and ten dollars and thirteen cents; therefore, Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That the state treasurer be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay to George W. Patton, agreeably to the certificate of the auditor general.

A FURTHER SUPPLEMENT

To the act to enable the governor to appoint notaries public, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, That so much of the act passed January fourteenth, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, entitled "A supplement to the act to enable the governor to appoint notaries public, and for other purposes," as requires one of the additional notaries public, authorized to be appointed by said act, for the county of Allegheny, to reside in the borough of the Northern Liberties, be and the same is hereby repealed; and the said additional notary public is hereby authorized to reside in any part of said county.*
