AN ACT

To continue the law graduating lands on which purchase money is due the commonwealth.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the provisions of the act to graduate lands upon which purchase money is due and unpaid the commonwealth, passed the tenth day of April, Anno Domini, one thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, are hereby continued in force, until the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

SECTION 2. That the provisions of the second section of an act, entitled "An Act to continue the law graduating lands upon which purchase money is due the commonwealth," passed the twenty-eighth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and forty-six, are hereby continued in full force until the tenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one.

AN ACT

Extending Market street, and Water street, in the borough of Brookville, Jefferson county, and to declare the width thereof.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That Market street, in the borough of Brookville, be and is hereby extended so far west, as to intersect White street, where said White street intersects the turnpike road.

SECTION 2. That Water street in the borough aforesaid, be also extended so far west, as to intersect White street; and that the boundary line of

said street on the south, be removed twenty feet north, commencing at Mill street, and running westerly until the same shall intersect White street as aforesaid, so as to leave said Water street forty feet in width, instead of sixty, as surveyed and laid down on the plot of said borough of Brookville.

AN ACT

Providing for the payment of certain claims.

WHEREAS, A number of witnesses who appeared before the committee appointed by the house of representatives of the commonwealth of Pennsylvania, for the purpose of investigating the charges preferred against the honorable William N. Irvine, president judge of the nineteenth judicial district of said commonwealth, were not included in the report of the committee on accounts of the house of representatives, in consequence of their bills having been lost or mislaid; therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That the state treasurer be and is hereby authorized and directed to pay to William H. Kurtz, the sum of eleven dollars; George Hammond, the sum of eighteen dollars; John Manifold, the sum of twenty-one dollars and sixty-eight cents; Franklin Wright, the sum of seventeen dollars; John Bringman, the sum of nine dollars and seventy-six cents, and Henry Y. Slaymaker, the sum of seventeen dollars, being the amount of their pay and mileage as witnesses.
