AN ACT

To abolish the district court of the city and county of Lancaster, and the mayor's court of the city of Lancaster.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in General Assembly met, and it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same,* That from and after the passage of this act, the act, entitled "An Act to provide for the erection of an additional court within the city and county of Lancaster, by the name and style of 'the district court of the city and county of Lancaster,'" approved the twenty-seventh day of March, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and twenty, and the several supplements thereto, be and the same are hereby repealed; and all records and proceedings unfinished or undisposed of in said court, shall be transferred and certified by the prothonotary to the court of common pleas of said county of Lancaster, by whom they shall be entered of record, and shall be considered and disposed of, as if they had originated therein; and all judgments heretofore entered in the said court, may be proceeded on by execution, or revived by scire facias in the court of common pleas of Lancaster county, with the same effect as judgments originally entered in the latter court.

SECTION 2. That from and after the passage of this act, the mayor's court for the city of Lancaster, shall be and the same is hereby abolished; and all offences, matters and things made cognizable by said court, or at the time pending therein, shall be cognizable in the court of quarter sessions of the peace, in and for the county of Lancaster.

SECTION 3. That the notice, enjoined to be given by the recorder of said city, under the third section of the act supplementary to an act to incorporate the city of Lancaster, approved the tenth day of February, one thousand eight hundred and forty-three, shall hereafter be given by the mayor of the said city.

SECTION 4. That so much of the act, entitled "An Act to incorporate the city of Lancaster," approved the twentieth day of March, Anno Domini one thousand eight hundred and eighteen, or any other act or acts authorizing a salary to be paid out of the state treasury, to the recorder of the said city of Lancaster, as a compensation for his services in said mayor's court, and all other laws inconsistent with the foregoing, be and the same are hereby repealed.
